SUMMARY

Built by the renowned Jonathan Wilson and fitted out by Louis & Joshua Boat Builders, *Tara* has a versatile cabin layout which can accommodate up to six people. In addition to the fixed double berth, the dinette and L-shaped sofa both convert into doubles making it ideal for cruising as a couple or with family and friends. The cratch cover with ventilation panels are designed so that pets can be left in comfort in the cratch area even when the side flaps are closed. Another unusual feature is that the flushing water for the macerator toilet is supplied from a separate water tank under the double bed. This clever idea reduces the demand on the main water tank and helps keep the boat level as the toilet tank fills. All-year comfort is assured by a Bubble solid fuel stove and a convenient diesel-fired central heating system. With a 3.5kW generator on the Beta engine and a 1.6kW inverter/charger, electrical power should be plentiful and will enable you to enjoy the benefit of the television with self-seeking satellite dish to its full potential.

ELECTRIC SUPPLY

Twin alternators: 12V 65A alternator charges 1 x 77Ah (780 Cold Cranking Amps) maintenance free engine battery • 12V 150A alternator charges 4 x 110Ah cabin batteries

Charging to cabin batteries also by Victron **70A** inverter/ **charger** in multi-stage automatic operation when 230V supply connected

The cabin 12V system is protected by circuit breakers in a switched panel with analogue voltmeter

230V circuit installed with one landline connection
• Independent onboard 230V power from batteries via Victron
1.6kW pure sine wave inverter/charger • Independent
onboard 230V power also from Electrolux Travelpower 3.5kW
engine driven generator • Manual selector switch ensures that
only one 230V power source is used at any one time

A **galvanic isolator** is fitted to inhibit possible hull corrosion from the 230V earth bonding

Protected by earth leakage & overcurrent RCBO

WINDOWS & DOORS

10 x 13in diameter **brass portholes**, all of which open

Two sets of side doors, one with aluminium framed **window**, 21in deep x 28in wide with slider
• The frame is gold anodised

One **dog box** on the cabin roof

The forward bulkhead carries steel skinned glazed doors with timber linings • Aft & side doors are of steel with decoratively carved timber linings • Inner glazed doors for starboard side doors

ENGINE

Beta B43 (BV1903) diesel• 4 cylinders, 43hp at 2.800rpm

- Engine built by Kubota
- Marinised by Beta Marine

Cooling is through a sealed skin tank

Engine control by a single lever



GENERATOR

Electrolux Travelpower 3.5kW engine driven generator provides 230V power at variable rpm



STERN GEAR & TRANSMISSION

Engine flexibly mounted with Centaflex coupling • Transmission by PRM 150 mechanical gearbox with 2:1 reduction

Weedhatch held down by quickrelease bar and easily accessed through a hinged steel hatch in the aft deck • Stern tube lubricated by remote screw greaser • An automatic electric bilge pump drains the stern tube sump

STEELWORK & STYLE

10/6/4 plating with flat bottom Shell in traditional style

Traditional cabin-edge handrails
Scrolled cants forward & plain
cants aft • Midship rope ring on
cabin roof • Raised guards around
the bow • Recessed eyes for side
fenders in gunwale

(Note plating thickness cannot be measured during ABNB visits and is based on reported information)

DECKS

Forward well deck & aft deck are of steel and are self-draining • Well & aft decks have Dri-dek matting

Well deck has custom built timber enclosure with gates (added security for pets and children)

Gunwales are finished with slip-resistant surfaces

TRAD FITTINGS

Traditional fittings include: A dog box on roof

Cratch: A glazed softwood board with raised top plank • Fitted with acrylic cover with zips & ventilation panels

Brasswork: Portholes, hinged tiller & pin, mushroom vents & forward navigation lights

Chromework: Tunnel light

2 fixed brass stirrup steps (which make climbing onto the cabin roof easier)

Steerer sits on two taff seats

ALARMS

Carbon monoxide. Kidde smoke alarm

decoratively tiled fireplace • Webasto Thermo Top C 5.2kW compact diesel boiler, controlled by mini programmer, runs 1 panel rad & 1 long fin skirting rad • 1 rad with thermostatic valve

FURNISHINGS

Sofa bed upholstery is plush Bournville

Dinette upholsterv is red/brown floral pattern

Curtains are lined & are hung on brass rods also included are porthole net covers (removable) and net curtains for hatches and shower room

Floor is fitted with solid dark mahogany boarding in the galley, dinette & saloon . Vinyl in the shower room · Carpet in the passage & bedroom

BEHIND THE LININGS

Ballast: The underfloor space contains concrete slab ballast

Insulation: The cabin is insulated by **sprayed** polyurethane (pu) foam behind all external linings (except underfloor) • Sprayed pu foam is widely recognised as the most thermally efficient form of insulation available for narrowboats • It is the only type that also acts as a vapour barrier

6ft 5in x 4ft 6in permanent double with interior-sprung mattress

6ft 0in x 3ft 10in double on Lshaped bed-settee

Hull: Below top rubbing strake coated with Comastic vinvl tar · Hull sides above top rubbing strake coated in black enamel

Superstructure: Cabin sides painted blue with light cream framing, blue aft name panel & red coachlines with square corners • Handrails are red

Traditional decoration:

Cabin sides carry traditional signwriting & scrolls

 Diamonds on aft hatch & around mushroom vents on cabin roof • Bow carries sun & moon with diamonds either side of the stem post, counter carries light cream over red panels


