



SUMMARY

Wow! What a lovely, bright and cheerful cosy boat was the first impression on entering *Avocet* on the day of ABNB's visit. At present *Avocet's* gleaming cabin paintwork carries no signwriting or other embellishments, but on board is a full set of signwriting stencils along with self adhesive roses and castles, if the new owner wants to keep the boat with her original name. Interior layout is in the ever popular, classic floating country cottage design, with accommodation for up to four. The combined saloon/dinette, at 18ft in length, forward of the open plan galley, gives a very spacious feel with ample room for the two free-standing chairs along with the L-shape settee. Programmable central heating accompanying the solid fuel stove will keep the cabin warm, allowing the cruising season to be extended. When you can tear yourself away to spend some time ashore or when *Avocet* is left on her home mooring, the semi-trad deck can be protected by a fitted tonneau cover. *Avocet* has been in present ownership since May 2013 and during that time the owners have worked tirelessly to bring her up to the standard that she is today and she now needs someone who can cherish her as much.

ELECTRIC SUPPLY

Twin alternators: 12V 70A alternator charges 1 x 110Ah engine battery • 12V 95A alternator charges 3 x 110Ah cabin batteries • Charging also from Power Master 25A marine charger in multi-stage automatic operation when landline connected

The cabin **12V** system is protected by **circuit breakers** in a labelled, switched panel with analogue voltmeter

230V circuit installed with one landline connection • Independent onboard 230V power from batteries via Power Master 1.8kW pure sine wave inverter • Automatic switching between landline and inverter • Protected by RCD's (residual current devices) and overload circuit breaker

ELECTRIC FITTINGS

Lights 12V: 9 brass rimmed tungsten deckhead lights, 2 brass bedhead lights, 1 shower light

Power sockets: 12V: 1

230V: 8

12V extractor fan with light: 1

External TV aerial socket to internal socket • FM aerial • JVC stereo radio/CD player with 4 speakers, 2 in saloon, 2 in bedroom

WINDOWS & DOORS

5 aluminium framed **windows**, 36in wide x 21in deep, all with top dropback hopper panels $\cdot 4 \times 15$ in diameter aluminium framed **portholes**, all of which open \cdot All frames are gold anodised

The forward bulkhead carries steel-skinned, glazed doors with interior timber linings • Aft & side doors are of steel with timber linings • Aft semitrad deck doors are of steel traditionally panelled • One set of side doors

ENGINE

Beta Marine B38 diesel • 4 cylinders, 37.5hp at 3,000rpm • Engine built by Kubota • Marinised by Beta Marine

Cooling is through a sealed skin tank


Engine control by a single lever • Engine under decking

Ventilation is assisted by hull side vent

Instruments: Tachometer, hour meter

Warning lights: Two charge, oil pressure, water temperature

Fuel: Approx 35 gallons in integral tank



STERN GEAR & TRANSMISSION

Engine flexibly mounted with solid coupling

PRM 120D mechanical gearbox • With 2:1 reduction to 17in x 12in propeller

Weedhatch held down by quick-release bar easily accessible through a hinged steel lid in the aft deck

Maintenance free stern tube lubricated by water

An automatic electric bilge pump drains the stern tube sump

STEELWORK & STYLE

- 10/6/5/4 plating with flat bottom

Shell in semi-traditional style

Traditional cabin edge handrails and deck edge cants • Raised guards round the bow • Aft semi-trad deck seat-lockers • Midship rope ring on cabin roof • Raised eyes for side fenders on gunwales

(Note plating thickness cannot be measured during ABNB visits and is based on reported information)

DECKS

Well deck and aft deck are of steel and are self-draining • Access to the engine compartment is through ply panel, which sits on self-draining bearers in the semi-trad deck • Semi-trad deck is protected by fitted vinyl cover when not in use Well & aft decks have rubber

matting

Gunwales, well deck, forward & aft cants are finished with slipresistant surfaces

Brasswork: Tiller & pin, mushroom vents, fairleads, pole & plank rack (over painted)

Aarrow Acorn 4kW solid fuel stove, set in decoratively tiled fireplace

Mikuni MX40 4.8kW compact diesel boiler. controlled by on off switch & programmer, runs 3 panel radiators & 1 towel rail

Dinette upholstery is red cotton piped

Curtains are cream, floral print brocade, lined & hung on brass rods with brass retainers

BEHIND THE LININGS

Ballast: The underfloor space probably contains concrete slab ballast

Insulation: The cabin is insulated by spraved polvurethane (pu) foam behind all external linings (except underfloor) • Sprayed pu foam is widely recognised as the most thermally efficient form of insulation available for narrowboats • It is the only type that also acts as a vapour barrier


